Responsibilities

The Head has overall responsibility for promoting equal opportunities throughout the School including in the Nursery. It is the responsibility of all adults to implement the Equal Opportunities Policy consistently throughout the school.

Equal Opportunities at Lancing Prep Hove

Promoting equal opportunities is fundamental to the aims and ethos of Lancing College. We welcome applications from prospective pupils from a diverse range of backgrounds as we believe that this enriches our community and is vital in preparing our pupils for today's world. We educate the individual, and aim to provide a safe, welcoming, tolerant, happy and supportive environment where each individual feels valued, in turn values others, and can flourish.

Lancing Prep Hove is committed to equal treatment for all, regardless of an individual's race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, disability or social background. Lancing College is a Christian foundation and we believe that the educational experience is enriched if pupils are exposed to as wide a range of cultural experiences as possible.

Lancing Prep Hove welcomes all children who can make the most of the opportunities we offer and can flourish in the caring environment of the school. We welcome children with special educational needs and disabilities, providing that our Learning Support Department can provide them with the support they require and they can access the school site which provides some challenges for those with mobility difficulties. We refer parents to our SENDA Policy.

Lancing Prep Hove offers means tested bursaries to a small number of children joining Year 7 who are awarded scholarships in order to make it possible for as many as possible who meet the school's admission criteria to attend the school. (Details of our provision for bursaries can be obtained from the Bursar's office).

Our **CODE OF CONDUCT** promotes respect and tolerance within our school community and we expect all children from Nursery to Year 8 to be kind.

The Head, the SMT, the teachers & teaching assistants and administrative staff all play an active role in monitoring the implementation of the policy on equal opportunities. Use is made of assemblies, Eucharist services at our local church, PSHE, REP, English and other lessons to:

- Promote tolerance of each other and respect for each other's position within the School community.
- Promote positive images and role models to avoid prejudice and raise awareness of related issues.
- Foster an open-minded approach and encourage pupils to recognise the contributions made by different cultures.
- Understand why and how we will deal with offensive language and behaviour.
- Understand why we will deal with any incidents promptly and in a sensitive manner.

Harassment in all its forms is unlawful and unacceptable; our Behaviour and Anti-Bullying Policies contain clear procedures for recognising and for countering discrimination.

In implementing our equal opportunities policy we look to strong and positive support from parents and guardians, and their full acceptance and support of the school's ethos of tolerance and respect.

Celebration of Diversity

Opportunities are sought throughout the school for the celebration of diversity and difference, e.g. through our Chinese Year celebrations and World Languages Day, as well as for our Christian celebrations. Other opportunities are sought through our support for various charities.

Requests for Variation of Provision (Faith, Diet, Dress)

Lancing Prep Hove is a Christian foundation and a Eucharistic community and its aims and ethos are shaped by this identity. Lancing anticipates that parents and pupils will be in sympathy with the aims and ethos of the College but it does not select for entry on the basis of religious belief, and we welcome pupils of all faiths, and none. Alongside the requirement that all prep school pupils attend whole-school Eucharist services, we support (as far as is practicable) those of others faiths in the observation of their own faiths.

Pupils with particular dietary requirements (whether for religious, cultural, health or other reasons) are individually catered for, and the Chef and his team are committed to ensuring that all dietary requirements are carefully and fully met. There are always a range of vegetarian, dairy-free and gluten-free options.

All pupils at Lancing Prep Hove are required to wear a uniform. The Head will consider written requests from parents for variations in the uniform on religious grounds, or grounds of health or disability, that are consistent with the school's ethos and its policy on health and safety.

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
