Message from Mrs Keep

Dear Parents

This time last week, I joined the rest of the school in heading outside to enjoy the staff v Year 8 football match. The battle lines were drawn not only on the pitch but also among the supporters, with plenty of children deciding it was the more mature legs of their teachers that needed their support, but a healthy majority who very much decided it was the Year 8s who they would cheer on. Pre-School

The children have been talking 'castles'. They had more of an in-depth look at the structures of a castle, pointing out features, such as turrets, towers, the size of the windows and the drawbridge. They drew their castles using 2D shapes and have just finished painting them. They are using their phonic knowledge to label the structures.

There has also been a focus on royal events this week. The children were given a crown to decorate with gems (pom poms and tissue paper). However, there was a catch! On the back of their crown was a number, this was the amount of gems they could use to decorate their crown. Everyone looked rather regal!









Reception

The children have been measuring everything dinosaur, using non-standard measurement. They are confident in the knowledge that they can 'use anything' to measure length or height. However, 'you need to use the same item' in order to make a fair comparison.

We have had our first visit to the ICT room and used all of our senses in our independent writing about the dinosaur swamp.











Year 1

The children have continued to explore their current Pirates topic and have been allowing their imaginations free reign with their creativity!

Cressida Cowell inspires Years 3 to 6

The children in Years 3 to 6 (and their teachers!) were thrilled to meet award-winning author and former Children's Laureate, Cressida Cowell, who came to visit LPH. Best known perhaps for her 'How to Train Your Dragon' book which was turned into a successful children's animated film by Dreamworks, with a live adaptation currently in the pipeline, as well as video games on various platforms.

The children had the opportunity to purchase books from local bookseller The Book Nook in Hove which Cressida signed for them. She spoke about her latest series of books, which explore the modern world where magic still exists but is kept secret, and where magic can open doors between this world and other worlds.

Cressida gave an inspiring talk, drawn from her childhood summers on a deserted Scottish island where she developed her love of nature and of Viking folklore and stories. She spoke with great passion about encouraging children to use and develop their imagination, along with the importance of research, which doesn't have to be boring! She challenged them to think about writing stories from the starting point of 'What if...' and to use their imagination to believe in the impossible.

The visit ended with a Q&A session the children grilled her with a variety of questions about aspects of the HTTYD series, as well as some thoughtful questions about her life and work.




Year 4

They found inspiration for their own designs by looking at chairs from different time periods which were designed for a variety of different purposes!










Lancing College Science Challenge


