Love Learning, Be Kind and Go out into the World and Do Good

Welcome to our first news bulletin of the new school year. Everything we do at LPW is based upon our three main aims: Love Learning, Be Kind and Go out into the World and Do Good. Our news bulletins this year will, we hope, reflect this ethos and bring the life and work of the school to our families and the wider school community.

Learning Power



We would like to introduce you to our Learning Power characters (from left to right): Resourceful Ranger, Resilient Ruler, Reflective Robot and Relating Red Fox were designed by the pupils last year and are used in their Learn to Learn activities. These help our younger pupils to explore different characteristics that help them to develop their own distinctive learning styles. These themes continue throughout the school with our Learning Power Walls in each classroom.

The Resourceful Ranger comes up with creative ideas and solutions to problems (Imaginative); creates the tools needed for success (Crafting); sees similarities in past learning and applies to new learning in order to move forwards (Linking) and seizes every opportunity which arises (Capitalising). The Ranger can never say no to a challenge!

The Resilient Ruler pays close attention to things. Nothing distracts or gets in the way of getting the job done (Focused); is always eager to delve deeper, constantly asks questions and investigates (Inquisitive); keeps going and never lets its head drop. *Try, try again* is its motto (Persistent) and loves new challenges. Tries the unexpected and isn't afraid to make mistakes (Adventurous).

The Reflective Robot understands its strengths, weaknesses, personality and emotions, realising the effect on others (Self-Aware); pays careful attention to detail, taking things one step at a time in a precise manner (Methodical); transfers a skill set from a previous task and applies it to new challenges (Transferring) and recognises what it knows, doesn't know and needs to know to find best ways forward.

The Relating Red Fox can appreciate others, their thoughts and feelings, and adjusts behaviour accordingly (Empathetic); can work well in a group, listening, encouraging, participating and taking turns (Collaborative); is able to work well alone, managing time and effort (Independent) and knows the value of new learning and isn't afraid to change its mind (Open-minded).

We are always proud to hear how well our former pupils perform in public examinations and this year was no exception.

At GSCE, Nelu M achieved an extraordinary set of results with six Grade 9s (the new 'outstanding' category) alongside two Grade 8s (the old A*) and one Grade 7 (the old A) and is studying Mathematics and the Sciences at A Level. Will S achieved four Grade 9s and five grade 8s (thus achieving a clean sweep of the old A* grades or better). Will is also an outstanding sportsman and plays in the College 1st XI football team.

At A Level, Sophie M-S is taking up her place at St Catherine's College, Cambridge after achieving A*AA in History, Politics and English Literature. 
