### LPW raise over £400 for Children in Need

Nursery and Pre-Prep children had fun raising money for Children in Need by coming to school in their pyjamas! They ate a Big Breakfast together in the school hall, choosing from a choice of cereals, toast and pain au chocolat,

with water, milk or orange juice to drink. The children coloured in pictures of Pudsey at home which they then covered with loose change and returned to school as a donation.

The Prep children and staff took

part in the livestream of the ***Big Morning Move*** – a High Intensity Interval Training workout by the Body Coach, Joe Wicks. We tweeted pictures of this which were liked by the Body Coach!

Our thanks to all who took part

and made donations to take part in the activities and those who purchased a Pudsey keyring or wristband. Lancing Prep Worthing raised £420 in total for this very worthy cause.



### Year 7 visit Battle Abbey

On Monday 11 November the pupils went to Battle Abbey to learn more about the Battle of Hastings. As this trip fell on Remembrance Day, children spent the two minute silence thinking about soldiers from more recent conflicts, but also those from 1066. Along with more serious moments, the students took part in combat training, tried to lift a Saxon axe, and enjoyed a spooky medieval ghost story. A highlight of the trip was climbing the 14<sup>th</sup> century staircase to gain an incredible view from the top of the Gatehouse.



### Year 3 explore the Stone Age

The children had an exciting time on their 'Stone Age Day'. They took part in fun games and a quiz, reproduced Stonehenge, held genuine Stone Age artefacts, learnt how the Stone Age people would have made fire and how civilisation survived. Following on from this, they learnt how the Stone Age moved into the Iron and Bronze age.

We are so grateful to our LPWA who fund workshops and events to enhance the children's experience at Lancing Prep Worthing.



### Change Starts with Us Workshop

The pupils in Years 3, 4 and 5 attended a PSHEE workshop based on this year's theme *Change Starts With Us*. The workshop was delivered by *Perform For Schools*; a leading provider of drama, dance and singing workshops.

The children's imagination was sparked and stimulated by role-play and improvisation led by a professional actor. They were left feeling inspired and equipped to make those small changes which can make a big difference.



### Drama4ALL Workshops

Year 2 were taken to the world of castles and dragons with a quest to find King Arthur's sword. They encountered a rather forgetful witch and a magical dragon whose spells didn't work. The potion for the cauldron was interesting too; anyone for a brew of shark's tooth, amber, dinosaur claw and eyeball? It all ended well with the sword recovered and all the children being knighted.

The Nursery children enjoyed meeting Katie, the friendly Wizard, who whisked them off to Camelot. Their quest was to find her missing black cat; on the way they learnt a new song, turned into bats, owls and unicorns and met a rather forgetful witch – but they did find the cat!

It was a stunning show with superb solo singing, group numbers, dance routines – it certainly gave us lots to consider for our own performances in the future. The children sang in the minibus all the way back to school!


