




Year 4 go Viking

A Bilingual approach to Empathy Day 2021

Year 7 marked Empathy Day 2021 by considering in their English classes the quote from R J Palacio's novel 'Wonder': "Courage. Kindness. Friendship. Character. These are the qualities that define us as human beings, and propel us, on occasion, to greatness." Year 8 listened to poems from Chris Riddell's book 'Poems to save the world with' and marked Empathy Day by reading Nikita Gill's poem 'Kindness' and Rudyard Kipling's 'If .'

In French lessons, Year 6 translated Empathy Day into French and impressed Mme Valantin with their knowledge of empathy, which they told her was due to their PSHEE lessons being well taught by Mrs Milling!

Always happy to take their learning outdoors, they read 'La couleur des émotions' out on the field and they explained how it related to empathy.
