

Reception enjoy the cold snap!

Reception enjoyed the cold weather and have been exploring ice. They investigated how water freezes into ice (using Mr Chef's big freezer) then experimented with different ways of removing the toys that had been trapped in the ice. A syringe filled with warm water was the favourite and most effective way of melting the ice.







The children are learning place value within 20 and brought their learning to life with a practical exercise. They had a lot of fun, using a large number line on the floor and then working out the answers to various questions, for example how many jumps between 10 and 16, and then found the right place to stand on the number line to give their solution.











Year 3 have an Ephiphany!

The children discovered how Epiphany is celebrated in France and linked it to the equivalent festival in Spain. They browsed a booklet about the best kings' cakes by famous French chefs and gave their opinions - 'Delicious' was the most common verdict! Next they learnt more from France 24 about Epiphany and also the recipe for 'une galette des rois' (the Kings' cake). Lastly, they explored the tradition of 'fèves' (the trinket hidden inside the cake) and had the opportunity to to play with them.

The children from Years 5 to 8 had a super afternoon of physical education activities including Quick Cricket, Football and Netball, along with a dance workshop.








Girls' sport


