Children's Mental Health Week

The children across the year groups have been engaging in a wide range of activities as they explore the importance of making connections with other people.



In Reception the children talked about how we can make each other happy by being connected and saying kind things. They played a game where they held hands then had to pass a hoop around the circle without letting go of each other's hands. The first time was very difficult but the children soon realised they could help and encourage each other. Each time the hoop was passed on the child would say a kind thing to the next child, for example, thank you for being my friend. They enjoyed it so much they asked to play it again the next day!



The children in Year 4 read the book 'The Invisible String' by Patrice Karst. The children discussed their invisible strings and who they are connected to – family, friends, pets, people who have died or they no longer have much contact with. We talked about the different ways we can connect with others: talking, messaging, online games, sharing, playing games, joining in activities, writing letters, helping one another and being kind. Elliott said being kind makes him feel good. Hattie explained her friend moved away and she plays with her online and they chat together.

The Year 5 children had 'Connection Circle Time' where they talked about the people they had made connections with that day and how it made them feel. Vivian and Barney waved and smiled at each other. William and Thomas made a new friend yesterday. Bertie had spoken to a friend on the phone and Leah said playing with her friends made her feel happy. We talked about the benefits of connecting with others, learning from one another, being kind and making others feel good, building our own confidence and improving our mental health.

Onamatopoeia is when a word sounds like the noise it is describing and is often used in comic books to show sound effects like Crash! and Bang!








Years 7 & 8 try a new, eco-friendly way of learning vocabulary


