


Remembrance

Mencap Marvel's lead assembly



Year 7 Team Build




Year 8 Learning about the Mary Rose

Ruby H was kind enough to bring in a project that her uncle had made on the Mary Rose when he was at our school in 1986!






England Rocks

Years 2-8 took part in England Rocks, a times table competition run by internationally renowned Times Tables Rock Stars. England Rocks required children to correctly answer as many multiplication and division questions as possible to give their class and school the best chance of winning.

The competition was fierce, with 187,079,415 questions answered collectively by 377,972 pupils from more than 4,404 schools and 70,774 classes around the country!

Our school stats were were astonishing too. We came 2013 out of 4357 schools and on average, our top class answered 269 questions correctly per pupil, with the best-performing pupil answering an amazing 4,532 questions correctly in total. Our top class, 5M, scored 8932, and our top pupil, Daniel B, scored 4532. Well done, everyone!
