
#### Year 6 play "guess the tune"

Dear Customer,

This is a courtesy letter to inform you that Major Gas Main and Service renewal works will be carried out in your area on **Sompting Avenue**, **Worthing**. Your property should not be included in this section of works for any service interruptions. We have included a map of the works showing the section of gas main and detailing the required traffic management involved. Please be advised that due to the location of the gas main in the road, for safety reasons for the public and our engineers we will have to close one lane of the road so there will be no Westbound traffic permitted on this road. A diversion will be signposted in place.

This letter is just to advise you of the works taking place in your area. We will only be working on certain properties in Sompting Avenue that still have the original cast iron and steel pipes.

These major works will start from approximately 19<sup>th</sup> February 2024 and if no complications arise, these works should be completed in approximately 16 weeks. Please be advised that in these fast-changing and challenging times we have to react to frequent amendments and disruptions to works, so start dates and timescales might be subject to change.

#### YOUR GAS SUPPLY WILL NOT BE INTERRUPTED DURING THESE WORKS.

We pride ourselves on looking after all our customers, so during the course of our works, if you have any concerns, please contact our office on 01273 497400 (Mon-Thurs 0800-1600, Fri 0800-1500) out of hours our office number will divert to our 24hr number.

These are essential major works to ensure the safety of the gas pipes, and it is our intention to complete these works as quickly and as safely as possible.

We assure you that every effort will be made by our engineers to keep any disturbances to a minimum.




#### Gas Mains Replacement Works:

The Westbourne Lane closure linked to the A24 gas works to start approx. w/c: 19/02/24 for approx. 16 weeks in total. The initial 6 weeks of the lane closure is due to the location of the gas main on the A24 junction which requires safe traffic management for the public and our engineers. The Westbound Lane in Sompting Avenue will be closed for the safe access to the gas mains. Only Eastbound traffic will be permitted.

The gas main runs on the 'evens' side of Sompting Avenue through the road.

We will insert the new gas main through the existing, and also upgrade the service pipe up to the gas meter of each property on this section. Dependent upon progress, the service upgrade works to the properties in Sompting Avenue will start from around 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2024 for 10 weeks.



We appreciate our work will be disruptive for road users and the local community, please accept our apologies for the inconvenience these essential works will cause.

Whilst these works can be disruptive, we can assure you that they are to upgrade the network to continue to provide the community with a safe and efficient gas supply long into the future. This area has a leakage history which is why it is being replaced.

We would like to assure you that our engineers and teams are working hard on this project, and that even if you may not always see them in the road- they are often working within individual properties completing the service pipe replacement to each property. We can come across engineering difficulties at times that require additional analysis and consideration, depending upon the location and condition of the gas main and service pipework.


